

## Core Anaesthetic Competencies for ICM Trainees

During the 1 year of anaesthetic training in Stage 1 (ST 3/4) ICM training trainees are expected to attain the **Initial Assessment of Competence** (<http://www.rcoa.ac.uk/node/217>) and complete the **Basis of Anaesthetic Practice** and elements of **Basic Anaesthesia** relevant to ICM.

Below is a list of the required units of training.

### Basis of Anaesthetic Practice

Control of infection

Preoperative Assessment

Premedication

Induction of general anaesthesia

Intra-operative care

Postoperative and recovery room care

Introduction to anaesthesia for emergency surgery

Management of respiratory and cardiac arrest in adults and children

### Basic anaesthesia

Airway management

Critical incidents

General, urological and gynaecological surgery

Non-theatre

Trauma and stabilisation
